

**REPLACEMENT ON THE WAY FOR LEAKING CITY HALL ROOF**  
*Abandoned Council Chamber Will Be Restored for Public Meetings*

The Beech Grove City Council voted unanimously Monday night to support Mayor Terry Dilk's proposal to replace the old, leaking roof on the City Hall building. The replacement will begin within a month.

"I committed to restoring City Hall on my first day as Mayor, and this new roof is a direct result of the conservative reforms we started on day one," Mayor Dilk said after the vote. "I appreciate our city council working with me to bring local government back where it belongs, on Main Street, at City Hall."

Since becoming Mayor, Dilk cut \$242,000 per year out of the budget and moved his own office back to City Hall. He renovated his office, a restroom, and a conference room with money out of his own pocket.

Once the site of Council, board, and commission meetings, the second floor chambers have been abandoned since late 2008. Today, the floors and walls are warped from water damage, and the dais is protected by a tarp.

Stopping the flow of water is the first step in the repair process. Once the building is dry, interior repairs can begin. The Mayor hopes to have public meetings back at City Hall by the end of the year.
