
EMERGENCY PROCLAMATION

MAYOR BUCKLEY DECLARES A SECOND EMERGENCY AND PLACES A BAN ON PERSONAL FIREWORKS AND OPEN BURNING

BEECH GROVE 4:00 PM: On the heels of the hottest days on record and the issuance of Executive Order No. 1, 2012 on June 30th banning private fireworks and open burning, Mayor Dennis Buckley has issued a second emergency proclamation (Executive Order No. 2, 2012) banning the use of personal fireworks and open burning in the City of Beech Grove. This is due to the drought conditions that have raised a significant threat of fires resulting therefrom. Please be advised that any offenders of this proclamation face fines up to Two Thousand Five Hundred (\$2,500). Please note that this proclamation does not apply to professional fireworks displays licensed by the State of Indiana.

Mayor Buckley's second emergency proclamation endorsed by the Common Council of the City of Beech Grove, prohibits the use of private fireworks and open burning takes effect on July 7, 2012 at 9:00AM, and shall remain in effect until Saturday July 21, 2012 at 9:00AM. This proclamation may be rescinded or extended depending on the weather conditions.
